Sweden Bangladesh Business Council (SBBC) was established in 2011 as a business network with H&M and IKEA as founding members in cooperation with Business Sweden and the Swedish Trade Federation. SBBC's purpose is to strengthen trade and business relations between Sweden

and Bangladesh, and particularly to encourage and support small and medium sized businesses.

Knowledge and contacts

SBBC has unique knowledge on how trade works specifically between Sweden and Bangladesh. Members can discuss and support each other, both in assessing business opportunities and in ongoing projects. Through the network, contact with authorities, consultants and other institutions in Bangladesh is arranged for those who want to establish business partnerships, set up own business or rent premises, for example.

Both digital and in-person network meetings with topicdriven activities are organised several times a year in order for members to exchange experiences and make contacts. At seminars ambassadors, other experts and business leaders share their knowledge and provide the latest updates on trade between the countries. In our Executive Lounge series members get the opportunity to introduce their business to the entire network in a more informal environment.

Swedish imports: ready-made-garments and, for example, leather goods, jute products, healthcare and medical equipment, services for the Swedish IT-sector.


